## 1. FRANCINE'S FRIENDS MOBILE MAMMOGRAPHY UNIT

It's returning to EACS! This is a wonderful and convenient service offered to EACS and to our community by Parkview Hospital and the Breast Diagnostic Center.



Parkview recommends women have an annual mammogram beginning at age 40. Women 35 and older, who are not experiencing any problems with their breasts, can get a screening mammogram on the coach.

All participants must have a family physician as the screening report is sent to the physician.

For participants that have insurance, their insurance company will be billed. For those that have EACS Group Health Insurance, Mammograms will be considered as a wellness benefit, covered at 100%. Please bring a photo ID and your insurance card.

*NO ONE will be turned away for inability to pay.* Francine's Friends has funding available and a donation toward the cost of the mammogram is welcome.

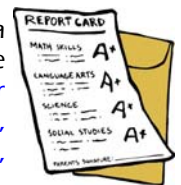
